The Association of Iowa Fairs enjoyed a near record turnout for its 2013 Conference and Annual Meeting held on December 13, 14 and 15, at the Holiday Inn Airport in Des Moines. Representatives from the 106 fairs in Iowa and of the 128 associate members converged onto the Conference Center for a weekend of learning, sharing and fun. Final attendance tally for the Conference showed 1,482 people registered for the event.

The opening business meeting of the Association was held on Friday morning, followed by the very popular session "Open Forum". The ever-popular entertainment showcase was featured Friday afternoon. Workshops that were featured Friday afternoon included; "Food Safety at Fairs", presented by James Romer, Compliance Officer, Iowa Department of Inspections and Appeals; and "ADA Guidelines", presented by Mike Williams, Community Advocacy Services, Office of Persons with Disabilities, State Of Iowa.

Saturday opened with the keynote address presented by Jane Jenkins Herlong, Certified Speaking Professional (CSP), professional singer, and published author. Jane, through her presentation "Find the Funny in Dysfunction", energized the attendees with her Southern charm, world-class humor and award-winning singing. As a Southern Humorist, Jane combined humor, original Southern stories, and her award-winning singing with life lessons into a light-hearted session that helped the attendees learn how to handle difficulties at home, the workplace and their Fairs.

After the keynote address, the Saturday schedule was packed with seminars, workshops, a breakfast meeting for AIF associate members and a non-stage showcase highlighting associate members that specialize in grounds attractions.

Saturday workshops and seminars included "2014 Fair Ideas" hosted by Arlette Hollister; "501c3 Charitable Status for Fair Associations", presented by Geri Huser; Skinner Law Offices, Altoona and Don Timmins of Timmins, Kroll & Jacobson LLP, Des Moines; "Response to Fair Emergencies" moderated by Chuck Cross, Indianola Fire Fighter/Paramedic and Sargent Rob Hawkins, Trainer Officer, Indianola Police Department; and "Rookie Status", which featured a discussion on IAFE's 'Young Professionals Initiative' moderated by Jenn Dunn, Linn County Fair.



Several 'open discussion workshops' were held during the Conference. These sessions featured a panel of persons with expertise in the topic subject. These panelists gave a brief overview of their opinions on the topic with the bulk of the session being an open discussion by those in attendance. These workshops included:

- "All Things Entertainment", which was an open discussion on all types of entertainment. Panelists included Jeannie Domeyer, Delaware County Fair, Lanny Simpson, Jackson County Fair and Jeremy Parsons, Clay County Fair.
- "Fair Board Basics" was an interactive discussion on the use of the AIF's website, Fair Board committee structure and purpose of a county fair board. This workshop was moderated by Tom Barnes, AIF Executive Director.
- "Livestock Exhibitions", were discussion items included State of lowa regulations proper animal presentations and showing, new treads in livestock production, responsibilities of a county fair and ethical practices by exhibitors and families. Panelists for this workshop were Doug Dodd, FFA instructor at the lowa Falls Community Schools, Mike Anderson, I.S.U. Extension 4-H Program Livestock Specialist, Dr. Ann Garvey, DVM, MPH, MA; Iowa Department of Public Health and Dr. Dave Schmitt, State Veterinarian of Iowa.
- "Youth Involvement & Youth Fair Boards", led by members of the Dubuque County Fair Board. The focus of this session was a discussion on youth involvement on county fair boards.
- "Dream Big on a Small Budget", hosted by Jenn Dunn & Heidi Steffen of the Linn County Fair. The session focused on ways for Fairs to get the most 'bang for their buck' on entertainment, and look at ways to increase fair involvement with inexpensive contests.

Saturday evening featured the very popular "Social A'Fair and Auction". This included a large social and supper attended by over 600 Association members. The 142 auction items were donated from member fairs and associates. The proceeds from the auction are used for expenses that are incurred by the Association in its efforts to secure legislation that benefits the fair industry in Iowa. This year the auction raised a new record amount of \$28,796. Following the Social and Auction was the "President's Reception", hosted by 2013 AIF Board President Joe Yedlik and members of the Jones County Fair Board.

Sunday morning started out with a church service dedicated to deceased fair board members and fair volunteers in lowa followed by the popular "Fairman's Breakfast". Following the breakfast Lisa Lynn of Lisa Lynn Consulting presented her workshop "Using True Colors for Enhanced Effectiveness". Lisa's 'True Colors' workshop uses a metaphor of colors to identify four distinct perspectives or personality preferences that enable the understanding human behavior and motivation of others. This workshop was sponsored by the International Association of Fairs and Expositions.
